DUFFERIN OPP WRAP UP EASTER LONG WEEKEND SEATBELT CAMPAIGN

(DUFFERIN COUNTY) - The Dufferin Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) have concluded the Easter long weekend seatbelt campaign, and the results are in. Officers conducted traffic stops throughout Dufferin County and issued a total of 337 charges.

The Seatbelt campaign ran from Friday March 29, 2024, until April 1, 2024. Officers across Dufferin County worked very hard to ensure everyone's safety this long weekend. During the campaign, officers were highly visible as they conducted seatbelt safety checks. Although properly worn seatbelts was the focus of this campaign, enforcement was not limited to just seatbelts.

Breakdown of charges:

- Seatbelt charges - 28
- Speeding charges - 178
- Distracted Driving charges - 1
- Impaired Operation charges - 4
- Stunt Driving - 9
- Other miscellaneous charges - 117

The results of the Seatbelt campaign show that there are still drivers and passengers who are not wearing their seatbelts. It only takes a few seconds to buckle up. A properly worn seat belt greatly increases your chances of surviving a motor vehicle collision.

Everyone travelling in a motor vehicle must properly wear a seatbelt and children must be properly secured in child car seat. Drivers are responsible for ensuring all passengers under the age of 16 are properly secured in either a seat belt or Child Car Seat.

DUFFERIN OPP LAUNCH COLLISION REPORTING CENTRE

(ORANGEVILLE, ON) - The Dufferin Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) has launched a Collision Reporting Centre (CRC) in Dufferin County.

Motorists involved in a property damage collision in Dufferin County are now able to report their collision at the Dufferin CRC which is located at the Dufferin Detachment at 506312 Highway 89, in the Town of Mono.

In many instances, there is no need for police to respond to property damage collisions in which no injuries are sustained. Drivers involved in a property damage collisions, can now conveniently report their collision within 48 hours of the occurrence.

The Highway Traffic Act requires that all collisions where people are injured or property damage is valued at more than \$2,000.00 to vehicles or property, or damage to any highway property to be reported to police forthwith. Reporting to the CRC will meet this requirement. In many instances, there is no need for police to attend the scene of collisions in which no significant damage or injuries are sustained.

The CRC expansion is an excellent example of Dufferin OPP's commitment to road safety and enhancing its policing services to road users and communities. Property damage collisions consume a large amount of police resources and time as well as put all involved occupants at risk of being involved in a secondary collision.

Dufferin OPP attended 1282 collision between May 1, 2023, and May 1, 2024. If officers do not need to attend and investigate minor collisions, this makes them available to tend to other policing services.

The CRC will provide a more effective use of police resources and allow frontline officers to focus more time on proactive efforts to enhance public safety. The Dufferin OPP will continue to provide the same excellent service in responding to collisions that require an officer to attend.

Collisions involving the following will continue to have an officer investigate the collision at the scene:

- Death or Injury
- Transportation of dangerous goods
- Involving large commercial motor vehicles

- Fail to remain (unless no driver or vehicle information available for follow up)
- Collision where there is suspicion of criminal activity including impaired driving
- Suspended or unlicensed drivers
- Uninsured vehicles
- Drivers refusing to share required information to other drivers
- Vehicles blocking live lanes of traffic
- Damage to private, public or government property
- Government vehicles, or
- Collisions involving a pedestrian or cyclist

The Collision Reporting Centre at Dufferin OPP Detachment - Mono Site hours of operation will be:

Monday to Friday 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Saturday and Sunday - Closed

If you're not sure if the collision meets the criteria, call the OPP at 1-888-310-1122. The call taker will determine if it meets the CRC criteria and determine if an officer needs to be dispatched to the scene.

The OPP recognizes and appreciates the important role drivers and other road users play in helping keep our roads safe.

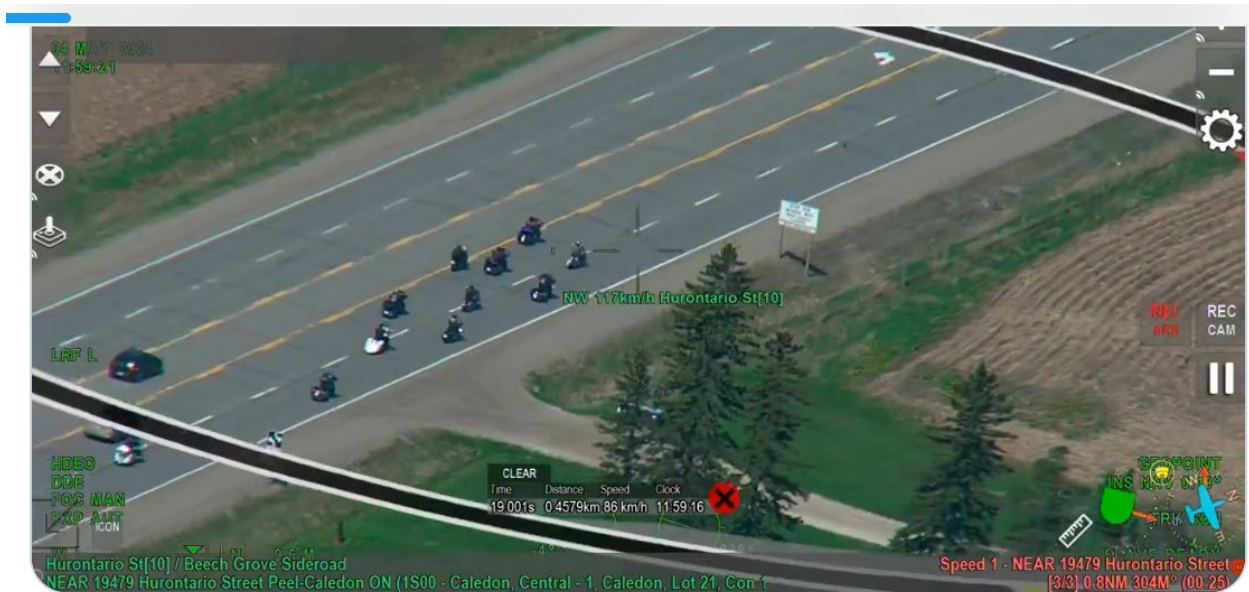

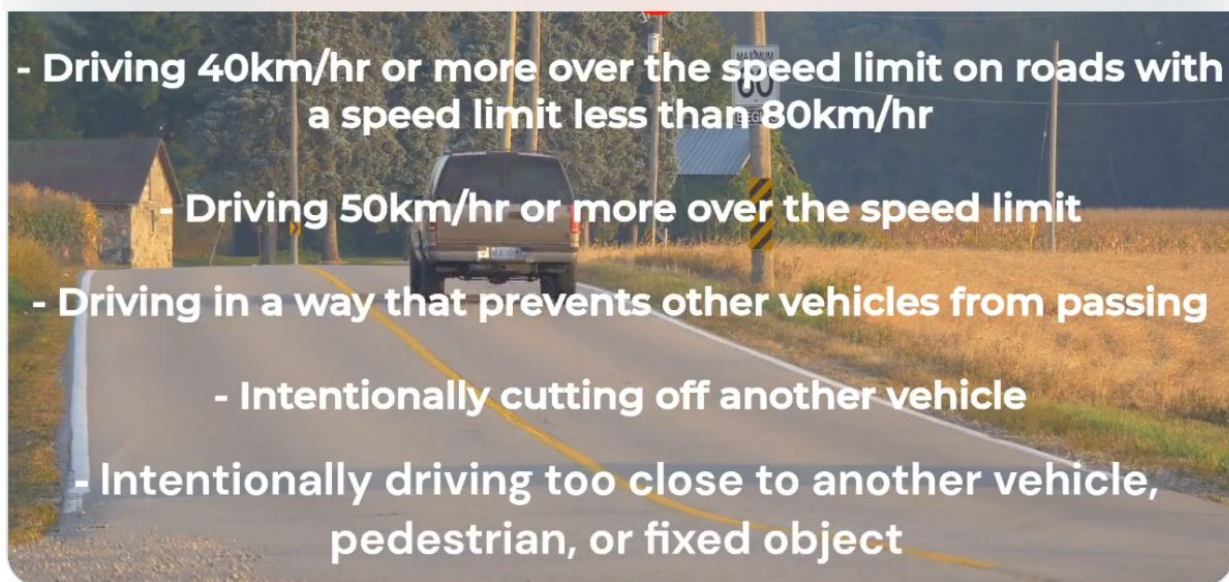

DUFFERIN OPP LAY MULTIPLE CHARGES OVER CANADA DAY WEEK

(DUFFERIN COUNTY, ON) - Members of the Dufferin Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) worked tirelessly to ensure the safety of our residents and visitors in Dufferin County over Canada Day Week.

Obtaining Insurance for you OPP Detachment Board

Background:

Prior to the CSPA coming into force on April 1st. All municipalities under contract with the OPP (section 10 of the PSA) were required to have a police services board. These boards fell under the definition of local board under the Municipal Act. Meeting this definition of a “local Board” permitted police services boards to be indemnified by their municipal insurance.

Municipalities that were policed by the OPP (under section 5.1 of the PSA), had no legislated responsibilities for policing under the PSA. Police services boards were not required.

Since the April 1st. (the date the CSPA came into force), all municipalities that are policed by the OPP are required to appoint members (municipal and community) to a Detachment Board. Some detachment areas have more than one detachment board within their detachment service area.

Challenge for Insurance:

The specific challenge is that Detachment Boards no longer meet the definition of a local board under the Municipal Act, so previous insurance coverage is no longer available to them.

This potential challenge was flagged by OAPSB to the Ministry in the fall of 2023. However, could not be confirmed until after the CSPA was in force and OPP Detachment Boards were recognized as the governance structure for the OPP policed municipalities.

Prior to April 1st of 2024 Some boards received quotes from brokers that were extremely high, and others were required to complete further documentation prior to review by their insurance company.

On April 1st, when the CSPA came into force. The few insurance brokers who had provided quotes, put the quote on hold as they had received information from the insurance companies that this issue required additional review.

- Without insurance, Detachment boards have been unable to meet.
- They have been unable to complete documentation required including a Terms of Reference document and a June 30th report to the municipalities (a legislative requirement - some have put a report together even though the board has not been formed).
- In circumstances where the community appointments have been left to the boards to finalize selection, community appointments have been delayed.
- Boards are required to meet 4 x per year to meet its legislative responsibilities
- The delay in a solution is becoming increasingly frustrating to our membership and non member boards/municipalities.
- This frustration has resulted in media interviews

OAPSB advised the Ministry of this issue and recommended an option to open up the municipal act and add language that would include “any board that a Municipality has a legislative requirement to appoint a member”. The ministry consulted with legal and this recommendation to open the act was declined.

Although staff put this forward, there is agreement that these boards are now separate entities from municipalities. The opening of the municipal act to add this language, although may have been the fastest solution it is not the best solution to this issue.

Although the OAPSB was not responsible for the cause of the insurance challenges for OPP Detachment Boards, we decided to take a leadership role in supporting boards with finding solutions to this issue.

Our top priority in this endeavor has been to provide insurance options to detachment boards that meets each boards insurance requirements at a preferred price in a timely manner.

A communication went out to boards on Friday August 2nd.outlining options for your Detachment Boards to acquire insurance. The OAPSB is exploring a group policy option and two providers have contacted us

with options for individual boards. Information on all options available are below:

Individual Board Options:

1. **Intact Public Entities (IPE) has an insurance product** available for OPP Detachment Boards. Unfortunately, we do not have a great deal of information to share with respect to the cost of this program for individual detachment boards. What we do know is that each board will be required to complete a Not-for-Profit Directors’ and Officers’ Liability application. **This application and product are available to you through your local broker.**

2. **Aon** has a solution available in place for Detachment Boards through your local broker. A pricing sample was provided, an application was also provided and will be posted on our website. They advised the turn around time 2 days.

The OAPSB has a Group Insurance Policy option that requires commitment from the majority of our members to demonstrate savings, stability of pricing (year over year) and protection of the group as it relates to the accessibility of insurance year over year for all.

After year one, this process will be streamlined, however in year one, we require expedited decisions and financial commitment to get this group policy in place in a timely manner.

OAPSB Group Insurance policy option.

****Boards must be members of the OAPSB to be eligible for the group insurance plan****

For reference: The 2025 membership fees are going to be at \$0.21 per property for each board.

No need for each OPP Detachment Board to complete an application to acquire insurance.

The OAPSB will complete one application that will cover all boards in year one and will collect fees (for year 1 only)

The process is streamlined further after year one. The insurance company (Medallion) will reach out to each board with a brief 3-5 question survey annually thereafter to avoid lengthy renewal cycles.

Highlights of the OAPSB group policy:

The date the policy begins is dependent on:

1. The timing for boards to make the decision on whether they would like to be part of a group policy or acquire their own insurance.
2. Payment of premiums. The OAPSB is not in a financial position to fund the policy and collect premiums at a later date.

5. Public Session

6. Land Acknowledgment

The Chair acknowledged the treaty lands and territory of the Williams Treaty Nations and the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation. The Chair also recognized that Dufferin County is the traditional territory of the Wendat and the Haudenosaunee, and is home to many Indigenous people today.

7. Welcome and Introductions

Chair Taylor welcomed guests in the gallery to the meeting.

8. Question Period

Community member, Gary Vipond advised that he recently met with Inspector Di Pasquale and thanked him for the meeting. He advised the noise in his neighbourhood has been a concern for some time. Mr. Vipond advised that on 2 different occasions the OPP had placed ads in the local newspaper describing an initiative called, "Quiet Running" and enquired as to follow up.

Inspector Di Pasquale advised that he was not familiar with the results of that initiative, but advised there is a Provincial initiative call Project Erase which stands for Eradicate Racing Activity on Streets Everywhere.

Mr. Vipond advised that the issue is beyond rumbling motors and that some residents are fearful. During one incident in the area of Zina and Clara a resident fell off their bike as result of a very loud backfire from a vehicle. He stated that residents are happy to help resolve the issue but are also fearful of an altercation if trying to get a license plate or photo of the offenders. He also mentioned Anthony Carnevale's newspaper article where Anthony indicated that he is not looking for complete silence but a certain level of respect.

Mr. Vipond also referred to a newspaper article from a London newspaper where the local police did a blitz on noisy mufflers, etc. in 2020 and reported that 110 charges were laid.

Chair Taylor said that residents need to know that there is a plan and what the outcome is. Chair Taylor advised that last year Dufferin OPP ran a blitz called Project Running and asked if the Inspector could advise on the results of that program.

Inspector Di Pasquale advised he will send out a direction to all officers to address illegally modified vehicles and officers will be provided training and resources to address this concern. They will also partner with MTO to target illegally modified vehicles. He will also speak to his media team to determine how the OPP can better inform the public on the law and repercussions of any non-compliance. Inspector Di Pasquale advised that the public can help by reporting any incidents through the online reporting tool or the non-emergent OPP line - 1 888 310-1122.

Chair Taylor invited James Bramley, Supervisor, Licensing and By-law Enforcement for the Town of Orangeville to speak to the matter. Mr. Bramley advised that they can only enforce bylaws on private property. He encouraged members of the public to maintain a 2 week log of any issues they experience and then report it to bylaw using either their online portal or calling Town Bylaw. He advised it is important to provide the following details: address, where the problem is occurring and the time it occurs. He advised they also try to educate the public on this matter.

Vice-Chair McSweeney asked Inspector Di Pasquale if there is a way there could be greater police presence on the streets that are known to be a problem. Inspector Di Pasquale advised that is where they need the public's assistance in

identifying locations, times and trends to assist them with targeted enforcement and presence where needed.

Winston Newton Bogart also spoke and advised he is part of Vipond's neighbourhood group. Mr. Bogart advised that when they first complained to police about the issue they did have increased police presence and in fact police sat in his driveway. He said one of the problem times is over the school lunch hour and when school is being let out. He expects that over the upcoming long weekend there will be issues 24 hrs./day. He also stated that many motorists use Zina as a bypass to Broadway and the issue isn't just noise, but speeding and failing to stop at stop signs. He re-iterated the worst times are from the time school is out until about 7:00 pm and on Friday, Saturday and Sunday evenings.

Bob Murray, a resident of Zina Street also spoke and advised that the noise detracts from their enjoyment of their back garden. As well, his grand daughter attends school in the neighbourhood and he wants it to be safe for all of the children.

Another resident spoke and said that she has a concern about the Spencer and Riddell area due to speeding cars and cars revving loudly. She described the problem time as Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings between 10 pm and 2 am.

Member Post thanked the community members for attending and voicing their concerns. She advised as Mayor that Town Council is actively looking at these concerns. A traffic study was conducted at the west end of Zina and there wasn't a significant speeding problem found. Town staff have been asked to conduct the study further east on Zina. The Town is aware that Zina and Elizabeth streets are used as a bypass for Broadway and the situation is being monitored. The Town does have a traffic calming strategy and is still in the information and data gathering phase to assist in determining next best steps.

Chair Taylor advised that there will be more to come on Spencer Ave. in the future.

Inspector Di Pasquale reviewed the Detachment Commander's Report for the months of April and May 2024. The following are some of the highlights:

- 23% reduction in violent crime over the same period last year.
- 38% reduction in property crime and break & enters were down 71.4 % and he attributes that partly to the great work of the Street Crime Unit
- 75% reduction in drug crime
- The Detachment has done 158 hrs. of foot patrol to maintain visibility and 170 hrs. of RIDE.
- In April of this year there were 68 mental health occurrences and 78 in May.
- On the Easter long weekend the Dufferin Detachment was in the top 3 detachments in the Central Region for enforcements stats. and on the pending long weekend they will be focusing on the top 4 reasons for traffic accidents.

Member Armstrong asked if the increase in domestic violence that Orangeville has seen is that consistent with other OPP detachments in the Central West region and Insp. Di Pasquale advised that he didn't know but could look into that and get back to the Board.

As a result, the Board is no longer covered under the Town’s insurance policy effective April 1, 2024. This is an issue province-wide for OPP detachment boards. While Board members are protected under CSPA ss.48(1) for all acts done in good faith the Board as a whole is not protected and under ss.48(2) is expressly liable for member acts/omissions as if ss.48(1) had not been enacted. Even though the Board has no assets, legal fees are still an issue.

Vice-Chair McSweeney further advised that Lisa Darling, Executive Director for OAPSB has indicated that the OAPSB is approximately 3 weeks away from announcing the development of an insurance product to be available to boards through insurance brokers.
